FireSmart actions reduce the risk of wildfire damage to your home.

Tasks to help you get started:

Clean gutters and roofs.
Clear leaves and debris from decks and balconies.
Keep grass and weeds under 10 cm.
Store firewood and lumber 10-30 m from structures.
Move propane tanks 10–30 m away from structures.
Keep combustible vegetation at least 10 m away from propane tanks.
Trim trees to achieve a 2 m clearance from the ground
Apply these standards to sheds and outbuildings.

Based on Research:

The FireSmart program is grounded in scientific research. Below are key insights from ongoing studies that highlight the most effective ways to protect your home from wildfire.

- Structure damage is caused by three different types of heat transfer: radiant heat, direct flame, or embers.
- Embers cause up to 90% of home and business ignitions during wildfire events. (Insurance Institute for Business & Home Safety, 2019)
- Airborne embers can travel across roads and fuel breaks, igniting structures several kilometres from the main fire. (National Research Council, 2021)
- Plants, furnishings, and attachments within 10 m of a home can ignite from embers, increasing the risk of direct flame and heat exposure. (National Research Council 2021, Institute for Catastrophic Loss Reduction, 2024)
- Homes on steep slopes with overhanging decks above flammable vegetation are especially vulnerable to wildfire.
- Managing combustible materials within 10 m of a structure is crucial to its survival during a wildfire.
- Homes surrounded by cedar hedges, junipers, or unmitigated coniferous trees are especially vulnerable to wildfire.
- Homes with no combustible materials within
 1.5 m of the structure are more likely to survive a wildfire. (Institute for Catastrophic Loss Reduction, Grouse Report, 2024)
